- II. Peter reveals a bad understanding of his confession: The Christ should not suffer and die.
 - A. Jesus silences the disciples (v. 30).
 - B. Jesus teaches the mission of the Christ (v. 31-32a).
 - C. Peter rebukes Jesus teaching (v. 32b).
 - D. Jesus rebukes Peter's misunderstanding (v. 33).
